Lake Hosts are our first line of defense against invasives that can really disrupt our lake ecosystem, diminish our quality of lake life, and significantly impact the value of our property!
- You welcome visitors to our lake and answer any questions they may have about boating and recreating on Laurel Lake.
- You educate guests to our lake about the NH Lakes Lake Host program and the importance of following the State of NH "Clean. Drain. Dry." law.
- You say "hi" to your Laurel Lake neighbors and meet others as they drive by or pass the ramp on their "round the lake" walks. Ramp chats with Laurel Lakers are the best! And, it's always nice to hear "thank you for keeping our beautiful lake healthy" from the community.
- Let's face it, sitting at the ramp for a couple of hours on a beautiful morning or afternoon, looking at the lake while reading a good book, or simply enjoying nature is not a hardship.
